Purpose of Open Space and Recreation Plan


- Assess and protect open space and recreational facilities.

- Provide an action plan for the next seven years.
- Educate the community.
- Integrate this Plan into the Town's Master Plan.
- Qualifies the Town for state and federal funding.

What is Open Space?

- Any conservation, recreation and agricultural lands
- Any undeveloped land, private or public
- Land used for passive activities such as walking, hiking and nature study
- Land used for active recreation such as soccer, tennis or any organized sport

- Age Concentrations in 2018:




Change in Population 2010 - 2018 by Age Group




Community Input - 583 Survey Respondents How old are you? (Demographics of survey takers)



How long have you been a resident of Lynnfield?




Conservation Areas Visited





High Priority Improvements:

- More trails for walking, running, cross country skiing, etc.
- Improved, consistent maintenance of fields, parks, and playgrounds.
- Indoor recreation center
- More parking at playgrounds, parks, and sport fields.
- More trails for off road biking.
- Boardwalks on wet trail sections.
- Better signage at conservation trail heads.
- Better trail markers/maintenance on conservation trails.
