#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

Warrant Articles on a Consent Agenda (permitted by Robert's Rules) are exceptions to the general process of Town Meeting. The Selectmen, Moderator and Finance Committee identify, for Town Meeting consideration, those articles they believe should generate no controversy and can be properly voted without debate. These articles are put on the Consent Agenda to allow motions under these articles to be acted upon as one unit and to be passed without debate. A 4/5 vote of Town Meeting Members is required by Lynnfield Town Charter (Section 2-3-9) to permit a Consent Agenda to be used since Articles will, as a result of the process, be taken out of order.

At the call of the Consent Agenda, the Moderator will read out the numbers of the articles, one by one. If one or more voters object to any particular article being included in the Consent Agenda, they say "Hold" in a loud voice when the number is called. The article will then be removed automatically from the Consent Agenda and restored to its original place in the Warrant, to be debated and voted upon in the usual manner. After the calling of the individual items in the Consent Agenda, the Moderator will ask for a motion that the voters pass all items remaining <u>AS A UNIT</u> on one vote. Use of the Consent Agenda process makes the Town Meeting more efficient by speeding up the handling of noncontroversial items.

#### Lynnfield's Scenic Roads Bylaw - Frequently Asked Questions

The Lynnfield Tree Committee has prepared this FAQ to answer a few commonly asked questions about Lynnfield's Scenic Roads Bylaw adopted at the April 2015 Town Meeting.

#### What is a Scenic Roads Bylaw?

Massachusetts General Laws allow towns and cities to designate certain roads as scenic: roads which feature trees and stone walls in the right of way that contribute to the town's scenic beauty and historic value. The Scenic Road statute applies to all public and private entities.

#### When will Lynnfield designate scenic roads?

In the April 2016 Town Meeting, Lynnfield residents will have the opportunity to vote to designate five of Lynnfield's most historic byways as scenic: Chestnut, Essex, Lowell, Main and Summer Street.

#### Who determines the public right of way?

Only the Town Engineer is able to define the right of way for each property.

#### How does the Scenic Roads Bylaw benefit our town?

Once designated as scenic, no changes may be made to the right of way without a review and approval process including public hearings and resident input. Homeowners benefit by having a voice in what changes may be made to the road, and its stone walls and trees which contribute to the aesthetic and historic value of their properties. No additional tax burden is applied to properties located on scenic roads.

#### Does the Scenic Bylaw restrict what I can do on my private property?

No - The Scenic Roads Bylaw only pertains to the public right of way. If an additional driveway or alteration of the roadway such as a new street is planned, the application process would be triggered. Most driveway modifications can be done unless the alteration involves stone walls or trees in the public right of way. Alteration or removal of trees or stone walls in the public right of way, without prior approval, may result in a fine.

#### How is a scenic road designated?

The designation process – initiated by any Town resident or entity -- involves the following:

- The road is recommended to the Planning Board, Conservation or Historical Commissions.
- A public hearing is held to discuss the proposed designation.
- Residents vote on the road in an annual or a special Town Meeting.

#### How are changes to scenic roads made?

The applicant must submit a written request to the Planning Board and the Town Engineer will determine if any trees or stone walls are located within the right of way. If the bylaw is applicable a public hearing will be held by the Planning Board and the application will be approved, modified or disapproved.

#### What if there is a disagreement with the application?

The applicant can appeal any decision of the Planning Board to the Board of Selectmen.
