---Paul Martindale, Chair, Lynnfield Conservation Commission, 2020 **Pine Hill Conservation Area** is a 9.5 acre wooded parcel that offers a welcome departure from its immediate suburban residential surroundings just 15 miles from the center of Boston.

Pine Hill Conservation Area was operated as the Mirabeau Fresh Air Camp, Inc. from 1929 until 1961. At the March, 1966 Town Meeting, voters unanimously turned over the custody and control of this beautiful property to the Lynnfield Conservation Commission.

In 2019, an Eagle Scout initiated a project to develop a loop walking path that would also provide the Lynnfield High School Cross-Country team with a wooded trail for team practices and meets.

We hope you enjoy your visit to Pine Hill Conservation Area. As with all our conservation properties, for your comfort and safety, activities are allowed from Dawn to Dusk. Please observe all signage as posted. Thank you!


