Foundations for the Plan

The Strategic Planning Committee's (SPC) foundation of Lynnfield's Long Term Plan is built upon the efforts of several Board, Commissions and Committees. These previous efforts include the work of the Lynnfield's Planning Board (PB), which submitted its report, Planning to Preserve the Best of Lynnfield, to the Board of Selectmen on a quarterly basis. The PB identified the Town's community defining resources, such as its historic and environmental assets, and recommended proactive measures to preserve the Town's vital economic, natural and recreational characteristics. Work to develop plans for the future needs as identified by it citizens in survey's and town hall meetings, enhance the Town's village center, improve the recreational facilities, assess the Town's public safety departments and facilities, and update the Town's Open Space Plan have also influenced the Planning Board's assessment to the Town's Selectmen. In that sense, this Strategic Planning Committee does not break new ground but presents instead a clear framework for action in the years to come. The intent is to look at least three to five years for the town to set priorities against. The Strategic Planning Committee will submit this Plan, through the Selectmen, to the public because we believe the goals it establishes, and the actions it suggests the Town Administrator, Robert Dolan, will positively impact the lives of all people in Lynnfield. In fact, one of the Eight goals proposed in the Plan is to Increase Participation in Town Government.

Developing the Plan

This Plan has been developed through a series of open public meetings and workshops initially facilitated by the assistant town administrator. Through these sessions, the Lynnfield Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) on which we serve has worked to determine the Town's long-term priorities. The SPC is comprised of members appointed by the Town Selectmen. This diverse membership has ensured that a wide array of viewpoints, professional backgrounds, not affiliated with any other Boards, Commissions, or Departments within the town, were considered for this new Board. The effort has also benefitted from the invaluable experience and insights of the Town Administrator Rob Dolan and the Assistant Town Administrator Bob Curtin. From this comprehensive dialogue, Eight goals were agreed by the SPB, each underpinned by a set of actions to achieve those goals. These Eight goals address a broad range of topic areas, from Town facilities to public safety, land conservation to school's long term plans. They do not address every matter confronting the Town, but we believe they address the most pressing challenges facing Lynnfield at this time. We hope by looking long term at issues the town will face, we will have addressed the issues for the town to collectively balance it priorities,

Establishing Priorities

Identifying highest priority goals ensures that these are the focus for the Town. The SPC recognizes that the Town may work towards goals of different priorities simultaneously but advises the Town to consider how pursuing other goals will affect achieving the priority goals in terms of the dedication of resources. Working towards the nine goals of the Strategic Plan will be incremental. This report will serve as a semi-annual report and will be maintained by the Staff Planner for the SPC to track the progress of each project or initiative. Within each priority is a gray box: When an item is completed it would be recorded in the gray box in each priority section, and another project or initiative from the Strategic Plan list of actions would be added to this list for the Town to work on. This based from Guidance from the Town Selectmen, Boards & Commission, Departments, Citizens. This will be posted on the Town's Website.

Most projects will be done on Debt Exclusion The public needs to have ample opportunities throughout the strategic planning process to vote, approve and fund any action and initiative that is generated from the Strategic Planning Committee process, and the SPC should work on ways to better inform the public.
